
## Press Release:

The heavy cruiser USS Indianapolis left Tinian on July 28, 1945 after delivering the components for the atomic bombs. It was on its way to join the invasion fleet massing for the invasion of Japan. The ensuing story goes in the annals of Naval history as one of the great boondoggles of all time. Two days out of Tinian in the dark of night a Japanese submarine put two torpedoes into the Cruiser causing irreparable damage. It sank in 12 minutes taking 1139 sailors into the water. Out of an estimated 800 who escaped into the dark Pacific night waters, only 317 survived. Stories of shark attacks, bitter cold nights in the water, and other miseries are told by living survivors. Read the testimony of Captain McVay who was court-martialed and eventually committed suicide only to be vindicated and pardoned in 1994. This story has it all. Mystery, suspense intrigue and magnificent stories of valor and bravery. The author was raised in Indiana, The PBY pilot, Adrian Marks was a life long resident of Indiana and the ship was
